Rain waters down current restrictions

Welcome rain over the weekend has brought water flowing back into Loudoun Weir and the end to Dalby's current level 2 water restrictions. Dalby Town Council announcing today that effective midnight Thursday 10th November residents will revert back to base level water restrictions under the odds and evens system.

Inspecting water flowing over the crest of the weir today, Dalby Mayor Cr Warwick Geisel said it was the first time the weir has been full since March 2004, but cautioned residents to remain sensible with water usage.

"Even through water restrictions are back to our standard odds and evens system the community still needs to be mindful of being waterwise to preserve our valuable water resources."

Under the odds and evens system residents connected to the Dalby water supply are permitted to use hoses, sprinklers, irrigators and soaker hoses on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday of each week if they have even numbered properties. Odd numbered properties are permitted to use hoses, sprinklers, irrigators and soaker hoses on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday of each week. A total ban is in place on Mondays for all sprinklers and hosing.

Authorised Council officers will be monitoring adherence to odds and evens system and residents are requested to abide by the restrictions, as failure to do so will incur a fine.
